

Expanding Women's Services - Fifth Floor Renovation Project

Mothers in Council Bluffs and Western Iowa deserve exceptional women's healthcare services. Once complete, our expansion projects will establish Methodist Jennie Edmundson as the premier women's and birth services center in our region. The second floor of the new medical office building is now home to one of the most comprehensive women's service providers. The floor includes 25 exam rooms, four intake areas, nurses' stations, physician offices, two treatment rooms, two non-stress testing rooms and a diagnostic lab. The floor also includes intake and exam room space for maternal-fetal medicine specialists from the Methodist Women's Hospital Perinatal Center in Omaha, located off 192nd and West Dodge Road. The medical office building also features mammogram and bone density scanning, two ultrasound rooms and more.

Methodist Jennie Edmundson Hospital has listened to the needs of our community and has responded. We are expanding and renovating our 5th floor to create a state-of-the-art women's services center of excellence. When mothers and families are ready for their special day, we'll offer them the very best providers, amenities, and choices to ensure the safest and most comfortable delivery possible.

We believe that Western Iowa deserves first rate medical care in Council Bluffs and western Iowa. Through our partnership with Methodist Women's Hospital, we are excited to expand the scope of women's services to Council Bluffs and Western Iowa. No longer will families need to travel to Omaha to receive premier care. Mothers will be served with skill and pride in the comfort of their hometown.

Our Women's Services Center has been staffed with highly skilled Clinicians to give our mothers and new babies the most compassionate, current, and extraordinary care to accompany this amazing new center. The 5th floor facility, consisting of 18,000 square feet, will provide: 6 private labor and delivery rooms where mothers can labor in a comfortable and soothing, "feel at home" environment; 12 post-partum rooms; 4 spacious Level II NICU bays with dedicated space for consults; expanded space for educational opportunities; 3 Jacuzzi tubs for pain control during labor; a C-Section suite; an infant security system that ensures safety of our space and a larger waiting area for family and friends.

We are conducting a \$1M campaign to finish equipping the 5th floor Center with the final pieces, technology, and equipment that will distinguish the Methodist Jennie Edmundson Women's Services Center as the premier women's and birth services center in our region. With your help, we will give Council Bluffs and western lowa mothers the extraordinary care and facilities they deserve. We hope we can count on your support for this campaign in the coming weeks.


