As we prepare for our annual Spirit of Courage fundraiser, we want to express our heartfelt gratitude for your past support of this important event. Over the past 18 years, you have helped establish Spirit of Courage as one of the largest fundraising events in Council Bluffs! We are excited to share that we are moving forward with this year's Spirit of Courage event despite the complications raised by COVID-19. Like so many other aspects of our lives, Spirit of Courage will look a little different this year.

The gala will be delivered in a virtual format through social media on Thursday, August 13. In addition to featuring an online auction, the virtual gala will honor all sixty of our past SOC Award recipients while showcasing the exceptional cancer services delivered at Jennie.

Since 2003, Spirit of Courage events have raised a total of \$1,877,000 for the Spirit of Courage Cancer Center Charitable Patient Care Fund. This fund provides much-needed assistance to uninsured and under insured cancer patients who need help covering expenses such as medications, treatments, and deductibles as well as everyday living expenses like groceries, rent and gas. Without this type of support, these vulnerable members of our community would simply forgo treatments and/or medication. In our current period of widespread unemployment and economic instability, financial assistance has become more important than ever.

Since March our volunteer program services at Jennie have been at a standstill. When summer arrived and the curve flattened it became time to prepare for the volunteers to return to a "new normal" as it has been called.

Our staff in the Volunteer Office has worked tirelessly to make sure the "new normal" is as safe as possible. I'd like to share with you the steps the staff has taken to insure our safe return. First the staff surveyed various health care institutions across lowa inquiring of their plans for reintroducing volunteers. They recorded the proposed activities and shared this info with the board in a paper entitled "Volunteer Redeployment Across the State."

Next they visited with staff in our volunteer areas to look at changes or modifications to our tasks to make activity safer. Procedures were rewritten as needed and placed in the orientation to return to our work areas. They also looked at new areas where volunteers could use their skills such as making masks and surgical caps and other virtual activities.

Our calling tree was utilized to call volunteers to ask about their concerns in returning to their volunteer tasks and requested suggestions to make volunteering safer. We thank the volunteers for their input. Volunteers returned to the hospital the third week of June in the gift shop, pharmacy annex, and the volunteer office. While the following week, volunteers returned to the patient services areas of outpatient surgery and the west lobby.

I appreciate the note sent out by staff to volunteers and wish to share it with you again. "On a daily bases, we are reminded how important you are and how much your Jennie family misses seeing you! As excited as we are for your return - your safety is our TOP priority. We also recognize that the decision and timeline for your return is yours alone." I was very impressed by those words. The staff also stressed "it takes a very special person to be a volunteer - someone who is willing to give a precious resource - TIME."

Thank you for giving your time at Jennie. After listing all the preparations conducted by our staff I feel we are in safe hands as we return to our volunteer duties. Hope I see you at Jennie soon.
